Course Number and Title: NURS 225 Nursing Therapeutics I: Assessment Practicum

Number of Credits: 2

Course (Catalog) Description:

This course introduces students to methods of holistic health assessment for adult patients and families across the life span; with an emphasis on adults. Focus and application will be on health assessment and related nursing therapeutic; therapeutic and inter-professional communication skills; helping relationships; the nursing process; and self-assessment. Quality and Safety Education for Nurses (QSEN) initiative beginner competencies are explored. Student must have minimum 2.7 cumulative GPA.

Course Learning Environment:

Nursing Therapeutics I: Assessment Practicum is an interactive course. Each class there will be pre-class work sheet, which may include: medical terminology, lab work sheet on Canvas and must be uploaded thru Canvas **prior to start** of class (**PRINT a copy** of the **Lab's worksheet** to bring to Lab). The Modules in Canvas include the assignments and due dates.

ATI Assignments must be submitted through Canvas prior to lab via screen shot with your individual name noted on upload.

Failure to submit the daily preparation work prior to each class will result in immediate dismissal from that lab & a grade of zero for that day. Students are responsible for any missed work.

Group Work: May include but not limited to review work sheet; watch video(s) on the

skill /assessment of the day; case study math problems, approved medical abbreviations; NCLEX practice questions, and the nursing process.

Station work may include: Hands-on assessment/skill practice; In-class simulations and practice; Review how to document the assessment findings and /or review the previous learned assessment /skills.

*Professional behavior is expected during classes and clinical, this includes but not is limited to; punctuality, respect, civility toward others seek learning opportunities, display personal and clinical/academic honesty, adherence to social networking policy (see Student Handbook).

Please note the use of **cell phones for texting, recording or video taping in class/clinical are NOT permitted.**

***Use of Electronic devices ONLY with Instructor Approval**

Methods of Evaluation:

1. Assume responsibility and accountability for self as member of the nursing profession.

A. Attendance (notification of absence) and punctuality (self and assignments)

**No credit will be given for class participation if the student is not present.*

B. Active participation

C. Checklists and any other required document for EACH Lab

D. Professional appearance and behavior (including respect, civility toward others, seek learning opportunities, display personal and clinical/academic honesty, adherence to social networking policy and **no cell phones in class/clinical unless authorized by the clinical instructor AND the clinical site.**

E. Maintains patient confidentiality

F. Adheres to ANA Standards of Practice I and II.

G. Self- assessment: Students will keep a journal regarding EACH clinical experience. See guidelines for journaling. At the end of the semester, the student will complete a self-evaluation regarding how the semester went, areas of strengths and weaknesses, and achievement of course objectives. There will be a short meeting between each student and his/her clinical faculty to review both evaluations (faculty's and the student's). The evaluation becomes part of the student's permanent departmental folder.

2. Demonstrate beginning skills in the health assessment & nursing therapeutics of patients and families in transition.

A. Demonstration of physical assessment & nursing skills competency checklist test (Complete/Incomplete grade). Dress Rehearsals include specific physical assessment competency checklist tests (See calendar for specific tests & dates).

B. Periodic demonstration of interviewing/communication skills during

clinicals

C. Laboratory Practice: In order to become proficient practice is required. Students are expected to practice physical assessment & nursing therapeutic skills. Demonstration of ability to perform assessment skills will be required. Students are strongly encouraged to seek additional assistance as needed.

D. Final Head to Toe Lab Practicum: Students will be required to demonstrate proficiency of selected components of the head to toe assessment.

E. Random Nursing Skill Students will randomly choose 1 (one) skill for student to perform in addition to Final Head to Toe Practicum.

3. *Apply data from nursing assessments to draw conclusions, formulate nursing diagnoses, goals and interventions.*

A. Patient-Care-Packet (PCP) -Draw conclusions from data collected on assigned patients and formulate nursing diagnoses, goals and interventions.

4. *Communicate effectively in written and oral format with patients and families and inter-professional teams.*

A. On clinical days, document the assessment focus of the day on PCP. The assessment foci are listed on Canvas.

5. *Explore beginner level knowledge, skills, and attitudes from the Quality and Safety Education for Nurses (QSEN) initiative.*

- QSEN assignments during clinical experiences and journal entries

*******NOTE there are general due dates in Canvas for the assignments like PCPs, BUT the Individual Clinical Instructor determines the SPECIFIC DUE Dates for the assignments for his/her Clinical Group.**

Lab Preparation/Participation/Attendance/Activities: each lab/class students will be given points for each of the following: professionalism (including being on time & attendance); preparation (material read & uploading in Canvas the assigned completed pre class work for each lab); active participation; documentation/review; and return demonstration

Successful completion of the assigned Assessment Skills Competencies Checklist Tests will be graded on Complete/Incomplete basis

**** NOTE Each Student MUST complete every check-off test in order to pass the course; if a student does not complete any competency test he/she must meet with the clinical faculty for successful remediation.** Failure to complete any competency tests will result in an incomplete in NURS 225, which means the student(s) cannot progress to NURS 231 Spring Semester until the student(s) have successfully completed the competency tests. **Students are to print & bring to class the blank check-offs for each lab.**

Final Written Exam: A comprehensive written final exam will be administered (Need to Know-NTK) which will be given via computers thru Respondus. For NTK exam each student MUST bring a laptop computer (laptops with Respondus can be rented through Xavier's Library) to take the exam. Specific instructions are on the NTK directions in Canvas.

Attendance Policy:

Clinical laboratory is a mandatory component of nursing education. Each laboratory adds to the student’s knowledge and increases their skills, competence and confidence. We strive to achieve a caring, productive community of learners who each have something of value to contribute to the education of others.

*Should circumstances prevent a student from attending class or clinical, it is the responsibility of the student to inform the instructor via direct communication by the student to the instructor at least two (2) hours before the start of class or clinical. (See professional behavior above) Athletes and other students participating in other Xavier University related activities should let the instructor know their schedule immediately at the beginning of the semester. It is the student’s responsibility to make up missed work. Fulfilling this responsibility and courtesy, is a type of professional behavior we seek to promote, and one the professional world unequivocally expects to occur.

****Absences and tardiness will be penalized. Every unexcused absence over 1 will result in a 2 % point deduction of the course grade.**

*****Late assignments (Journals & PCP’s ONLY) will result in a ten-point reduction per day for 3 days for that particular assignment.**

*****After 3 days the assignment will not be accepted and a zero (0) will be recorded for the assignment. Any exceptions to this policy for extreme unforeseen circumstances must be approved by the Clinical faculty & Course Coordinators.**

Clinical Appearance: Students are required to wear the uniform **described in the student handbook for all **clinical experiences, simulation.** Failure to comply with the professional dress code may result in the student **being dismissed from the unit and receiving an unsatisfactory evaluation for the day. This includes nametags.****

**** Need-To-Know (NTK) Test:** There is certain information that is essential for nursing practice that all nurses must learn and know. A perfect score on the NTK test is required in-order to pass Nurs 225. Portions of the test missed must be retaken up two (2) times until the student answers all questions correctly. However, the first score on the test will be the grade earned for grade calculation purposes and will contribute toward your course grade. ****The 100% achievement needs to occur by the end of exam week.**

There is no filming/picture taking allowed in the practicum course without explicit

instruction from faculty. Students are not allowed to be in lab after hours without an instructor present.

No Use of cell phone or other electronics during lab and/or clinicals, unless authorized by clinical instructor.

APA format- as a professional nurse the students are expected to reference ALL used resources in APA format for EVERY Assignment turned in including the PCPs &/or the 2 required Nursing Diagnosis + any other turned in assignment; points will be deducted if references are not in APA format on ANY assignment.

Professional Behavior: Please read the Xavier School of Nursing Handbook regarding professional behavior in both the lab and the clinical site. Excessive absences and tardiness will also be treated as unprofessional behavior. Cell phones should be on silent and in your pocket or book bag during lab and clinical. It is against Xavier's and health care facilities' policies to access your cell phone in patient care areas. The clinical time is a wonderful opportunity to learn from your faculty as well as from your peers. Respectful behavior to all peers and faculty is expected at all times.

Uniform: Please review the Xavier School of Nursing uniform policy as outlined in the handbook. Students are to wear the appropriate identification at all times when on the clinical unit.

Clinical Sites: Client privacy must be upheld at all times. This includes any paperwork, conversation, social media, and e-mail. Please review the HIPAA policy in the Xavier School of Nursing Handbook. Violation of privacy carries serious consequences. Do not bring valuables to the clinical area. There may not be a secured area for your belongings. Any identification badge or parking permit issued by the facility is the property of that facility and is to be returned to your clinical faculty on your last clinical day. Failure to return these may result in a \$50.00 fine.

Academic Honesty Policy: (from Xavier policy)

The pursuit of truth demands high standards of personal honesty. Academic and professional life requires a trust based upon integrity of the written and spoken word. Accordingly, violations of certain standards of ethical behavior will not be tolerated at Xavier University. These include theft, cheating, plagiarism, unauthorized assistance in assignments and tests, unauthorized copying of computer software, the falsification of results and material submitted in reports or admission and registration documents, and the falsification of any academic record including letters of recommendation. **All work submitted for academic evaluation must be the student's own.** Certainly, the activities of other scholars will influence all students. However, the direct and unattributed use of another's efforts is prohibited, as is the use of any work untruthfully submitted as one's own. Penalties for violations of this policy may include one or more of the following: a zero for that assignment or test, an "F" in the course, and expulsion from the University. The dean of the college in which the student is enrolled is to be informed in writing of all such incidents, though the teacher has full authority to assign the grade for the

assignment, test, or course. If disputes of interpretation arise, the student, faculty member, and chair should attempt to resolve the difficulty. If this is unsatisfactory, the dean will rule in the matter. As a final appeal, the academic vice president will call a committee of tenured faculty for the purpose of making a final determination.

In addition to The Academic Honesty Policy of Xavier University, the American Nurses' Association's Code of Ethics includes provisions which hold nurses accountable for demonstrating integrity, knowledge development and competency to promote personal and professional growth. Students are expected to work toward meeting these standards throughout their coursework.

Social Media:

Social media and the Internet provide an important medium for sharing information and offers easily accessible methods for mass communication. Nursing students must be aware of the risks and consequences associated with social networking. On-line social networking (e.g., Face book, MySpace, Twitter, blogs, etc.) are open, publicly accessible sites. Unprofessional or unbecoming online behavior undermines not only the nursing student's reputation, but may also have negative implications for Xavier University, and the profession of nursing. Certain violations in the use of social media may expose the offender to criminal and civil liability.

The following are taken from the American Nurses Association Social Networking Recommendations and modified to serve as a guide to students to avoid potential problems.

1. Standards of professionalism are the same on-line as in any other circumstance.
2. Never post photographs or any information gained in a nurse-patient relationship.
3. Maintain professional boundaries in the use of electronic media. Online contact with patients blurs these boundaries.
4. Do not post inflammatory or unflattering information about peers, patients, clinical sites and/or their employees on any social media site. Make every effort to present yourself as mature, responsible, and professional.
5. Do not take photos or recordings of a patient in your clinical setting or peers in their clinical or classroom learning environment without obtaining special permission utilizing the appropriate forms.
6. Promptly report any breach of confidentiality or privacy to your faculty member.
7. Do not share any protected health information. (HIPAA)
